

Competition for ESO alumni

Colegio Monfort, from Loeches, and Lope de Vega, from Alcalá de Henares, win the final of the Entreredes Olympics in Madrid

Its students will represent the Community of Madrid in the national final on 6 June.

Over 4,200 secondary school students from Madrid have participated in this year's Olympiads.

Colegio Monfort, from Loeches - in the 1st, 2nd and 3rd ESO categories - and Colegio Lope de Vega, from Alcalá de Henares - in the 4th ESO category - have won the regional final of the Entreredes Olympics, and will represent the Community of Madrid in the national final, to be held on 6 June.

The competition entailed team games of **Entreredes**, the video game created by Red Eléctrica (the company responsible for transmission and operation of the electricity system in Spain to teach younger generations in a fun and interactive way how the Spanish electricity system works and to review content taught in the classroom.

In the **Entreredes Olympics**, secondary school students from the whole country compete to demonstrate who has best mastered the subjects taught in the course (Geography, Physics, Mathematics, Literature...) and above all what they have learnt about energy, the ecological transition and the Spanish electricity system.

Over 4,200 secondary school students from the Community of Madrid took part in this year's **Entreredes Olympics**. Throughout the country, this amounts to almost 54,000 ESO students from eleven autonomous communities and the autonomous city of Ceuta, who have used the game and participated in this edition of the Olympics.
